## The Florida Behavioral Health Association Applauds Florida Leads Budget

**Tallahassee, Fla**.—The Florida Behavioral Health Association (FBHA) applauds Governor Ron DeSantis for continuing to prioritize Florida's community behavioral health system. With the release of his FY 2021-2022 recommended <u>Florida Leads Budget</u>, the governor included more than \$31 million for adults and children who suffer from mental illness, more than \$178 million in state and federal funding to fight the opioid epidemic, and more than \$32 million to preserve funding for services through Florida's child welfare system that support children and families.

"The Governor was spot on when he stated that COVID-19 has affected Floridians' health and well-being in unimaginable ways," said FBHA President and CEO Melanie Brown-Woofter. "Unfortunately, that impact has resulted in more people living with depression, anxiety, and communities experiencing increased overdose deaths and suicides over the past year. The demand for mental health and addiction services continues to rise. With this recommended budget, FBHA's community behavioral health providers can continue to provide live-saving treatment services for Floridians. We are grateful to have a Governor who prioritizes the healthcare needs of all Floridians."
