The Florida Behavioral Health Association Applauds the Florida Legislature for Restoring Crucial Funding in State Budget

Tallahassee, Fla.—The Florida Behavioral Health Association (FBHA) applauds the entire Florida Legislature for restoring crucial funding that supports programs for thousands of Floridians who are facing mental health and substance use challenges.

With the passage of the General Appropriations Act, the Legislature preserved mental health and substance use funding. Lawmakers also provided COVID-19 relief funds to mental health and substance use providers, directed opioid settlement funding to evidence-based programs such as Medication Assisted Treatment, and targeted additional funds to further engage minority populations in community-based services related to mental health and substance use.

"Facing unprecedented economic uncertainty this session, the Florida Legislature demonstrated support to our most vulnerable citizens by prioritizing the lifesaving mental health and substance use services they depend on," Melanie Brown-Woofter, FBHA's President and CEO, said. "With so many of our friends and neighbors suffering from the stresses of this prolonged pandemic, FBHA and our statewide members are truly grateful to work with state legislators who invest in healthcare services that provide hope and a path forward for those in need."
